

Here is my FeederWatch data for the past two days. Observations were at Fritz Creek, about 8.5 miles east of Homer.

I have a pair of Downy Woodpeckers visiting my feeder for the past several days. They are feeding on sunflower seeds. Since I live in a log cabin, I don't encourage woodpeckers with suet feeders. But these two don't seem to be foraging/pecking on the pecking on the logs so I won't chase them away.

Also had a Brown Creeper for the first time. In fact, got some nice shots that I will post later.

As usual, I had Black-capped Chickadees (4), Boreal Chickadee (1), Red-breasted Nuthatch (3 all with different shades on red on the breast), Pine Grosbeak (3), and Pine Siskin (4). For some reason, my feeder doesn't attract large flocks of grosbeaks or siskin's, like other feeders in the area. One difference between my lot and the others is that it is more heavily forested, but I think that would be a plus. George
